Ash Wednesday Marks the Beginning of Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6. Since earliest times the Church has set aside these forty days as a period for prayer, penance, sacrifice and almsgiving, a time of preparation for the great celebration of Easter.

The Lord speaks through the prophet Joel in the first reading on Ash Wednesday, *Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord your God*. As Lent approaches we are about to embark on a spiritual journey to a closer relationship with God.

We are pleased to provide the *Magnificat Lenten Companion*, a collection of daily reflections and prayers intended to make your journey more fruitful. Copies are available at the church doors.

The schedule for Ash Wednesday Masses and the distribution of ashes appears at left. On the right is the March schedule for Stations of the Cross, a traditional Lenten devotion that follows the path of Christ from Pilate's praetorium to Christ's tomb.

You may draw closer to the Lord at Eucharistic Adoration, offered on Mondays at 7 PM. In the quiet of early evening spend an hour in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

At the Foot of The Cross - Two Opportunities for Music and Reflection

Peter and the Saint Ann Choir will provide the music for this special evening, with meditations by Amy Ekeh, Deacon Art Miller and Sr. Virginia Herbers, ASCJ. (You may recall that this event was canceled last year because of snow. Snow date for this year: Friday, March 15.)

Lenten Reflection - Saint Joseph's Place in the Earthly Trinity

The Men of Saint Joseph invite all parishioners to join them on **Tuesday, March 19 at 7:00 PM** at Saint Gabriel Church for a timely Lenten reflection by Aaron Joseph. On this, the Feast of Saint Joseph, Aaron will reflect on the patron of the Church and of our Archdiocese. What place does Saint Joseph have in our devotional lives? How are we to understand his universal place alongside Jesus and Mary? You'll want to hear Aaron's thoughts on *Saint Joseph's Place in the Earthly Trinity*.

Aaron has made private perpetual vows to live as a consecrated disciple of Jesus, the Son of God and Son of Joseph and Mary and has begun a lay apostolate to promote Saint Joseph's universal patronage. Parishioners and friends, men and women, adults and young people are invited to this Lenten presentation.


It promises to be a great weekend. According to the renowned Ministry Weather Service, the forecast for March 30/31 is "FAIR, as in Ministry Fair." See you there!

Celebration of the Easter Triduum

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day, unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil, celebrated this year on Saturday, April 20 at 8:00 PM at Saint Gabriel Church.


