Saint Raphael Parish Prayer and Worship Committee Report from Ann Eden:

Stations of the Cross: Good attendance at Friday afternoon Stations. Very poor at the teen-led Stations at Saint Gabriel's on Friday, March 10th. This Friday we'll have 3:00 p.m. Stations at Saint Ann's (*Mary's Way of the Cross*) and teen-led Stations (*The Way of the Cross for Children* by Ann Naffziger) at Saint Gabriel's at 7:00 p.m. These Stations of the Cross are open to anyone who can attend in the evening.

Lenten Retreat: Great attendance at both sessions of *Following Jesus Into the Desert* (March 12/13, reflections by Fr. Maroney, music by the Saint Ann Choir). Our thanks to Father, to the choir and to Peter DeMarco, who was instrumental (how appropriate is that?!) in organizing this very special event.

Social Justice/Human Concerns: Meeting held on March 20, 2023

Present: Al May, chair, Kathleen Buchanan, Wally Hauck, John Marmolejo, and Manfred Mohring Communicating Appeals for Disaster/ Ukrainian War Relief to parishioners:

Members discussed how best to handle requests from parishioners looking for directions on how to make donations. Parishioners are asking how to provide support to groups who are preferably local and are involved in relief efforts for earthquake / other disaster relief and victims of the war in Ukraine.

The group decided the best way to approach this was to publish information and updates on these groups in the weekly bulletin and monthly newsletter.

This would also include groups with which the parish has collaborated in the past or might in the future, such as The Underground (human trafficking) and All in for Milford (food insecurity). Father John and the council members all agreed.

Al will send information to Monica (weekly bulletin) and Ann Eden (monthly newsletter).

Parish garden:

Members discussed a proposal to create a parish vegetable garden on land near the St. Ann rectory. The produce would go to the parish food pantry during the late summer / early fall months. The committee and council all agreed this would be a good thing.

Father John shared there is no plan to sell the property. Other questions that need to answer include maintenance responsibilities, access to water and underwriting costs.

Other activities:

Upcoming activities in which parishioners might like to get involved or participate include:

- The planned Juneteenth (June 19th) celebration on the Green.
- Our annual Homefront project, scheduled for Saturday, September 16th.

Maria Tomasetti also provided information on the following:

- 1. Catholic Relief Services Lenten Rice Bowl collection is now underway.
- 2. Wednesday morning pickups from the Connecticut Food Bank for our food pantry.
- 3. Recent activities by CONECT, All In For Milford, the status of our "pizza to go" activities at Beth El Center, and a planned visit on Saturday, April 29 at 11 am. to Four Corners Rest Home for an hour of music and fun activities. - We have two brothers from Afghanistan who are working and sending money to their families.
- We have a refugee from Senegal who is also doing well.

Prayers for Milford Christian Academy:

Wally Hauck suggested we encourage all parishioners to pray for success of the Milford Christian Academy in their legal battle with the State of Connecticut over a vaccine mandate for children attending their schools.

A change in the state law (removing religious exemptions) mandates all children who attend their day care center be vaccinated even if those vaccines were developed using live stems cells from the kidneys of aborted babies.
