May First Communion Weekends: Celebrations for the Parish Family

The weekend Masses celebrated at Saint Raphael Parish on May 6/7 and May 20/21 will be joyous celebrations for the entire parish family. 34 of the youngest members of our faith community will be receiving Jesus in Holy Communion for the very first time. We hope that as many parishioners as possible will be with us to welcome these young people to the Lord's table.

From 2020 through 2022 safety considerations necessitated by the pandemic dictated that we plan separate Saturday morning First Communion Masses. They were beautiful, of course they were, but something was missing: the joy and participation of the entire parish community.



With First Eucharist at regularly scheduled weekend Masses, our parish community offers a wonderful example to the children and their young families of the importance of receiving Jesus in Holy Communion every week. Although a child's First Communion Day is special because it is the first time a child receives Jesus in Holy Eucharist, our presence at Mass and our reception of Eucharist shows them that the second, third or fourth time - or the 2,000th, 3,000th or 4,000th time - is equally important.

The Eucharist, Holy Communion, is the most precious gift that Jesus gave us. We believe that the whole Christ is truly present in this Blessed Sacrament - body, blood, soul, and divinity - under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead (USCCB).

We joyfully welcome our First Communion children and their families to worship with us often as part of our Saint Raphael Parish community of faith and to receive Jesus in Holy Communion, the meal of God's family.

The Glorious Feast of Pentecost

The Easter season closes with the Feast of Pentecost, which falls this year on May 28.

A "strong driving wind" filled the Upper Room where Mary and the disciples had gathered and "tongues as of fire" came to rest on each of them. Strengthened now with the gifts and fruits of the Spirit they

could fulfill Christ's great commission to go out to all the world and tell the Good News.

Pentecost is the birthday of the Church. In answer to the Psalmist's prayer the Lord sent out his Spirit to renew the face of the earth.



Who Are Your Nominees for Pastoral Council? Submit Your Nominations by Sunday, May 7

The annual Pastoral Council selection process is underway! Nominations for three new members are due by Sunday, May 7th. At the Council's May 22nd meeting new members will be chosen by lot to serve three year terms.

The Council meets on a monthly basis from September through May. Working together and making decisions by consensus under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, members advise the pastor in areas such as prayer and worship; faith formation; social justice and parish life.

Eligible nominees must be at least 18 years old; baptized and confirmed Roman Catholics in good standing with the Church; registered and supporting members of Saint Raphael Parish; and committed to giving the time needed for Council participation.

Please think carefully and prayerfully about parishioners (*including yourself*) who would serve the parish well as Council members. Using the form in the weekly bulletin, drop your nominations in the collection basket by the May 7th deadline.

At the May 22nd meeting, after a prayer for God's guidance and following an ancient Biblical tradition, the names of the new members will be drawn by lot.
