# Celebrate the Holy Spirit at GIFT's Pentecost Celebration

Tuesday, June 6, between 6:00 and 7:30 p.m. in the Saint Ann Parish Center

The Easter season came to a glorious close on Sunday, May 28, the Feast of Pentecost. (The word comes from the Greek *pentekoste*, meaning 50th.) Fifty days after the Resurrection of the Lord we remember and celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles.

Mark your calendars and plan to be with us for GIFT's Pentecost Celebration and Activity Open House. Drop in to the Parish Center on Tuesday, June 6, any time between 6 and 7:30 p.m. Come to the party -Pentecost is often referred to as the birthday of the Church. There will be food (pizza, beverages and snacks) and fun (spirited activity centers featuring crafts, activities, coloring and puzzles), opportunities to learn more about Pentecost and about the 3rd person of the Trinity.

On that first Pentecost the Apostles, Mary, and Jesus' first followers had gathered in fear in a locked Upper Room. The Apostles were afraid to go out and preach Jesus and his message. But after the power and gifts of the Holy Spirit came upon them, they were no longer afraid. They went out immediately and preached to everyone - even those who spoke other languages. This was the beginning of their earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations, and the beginning of the Church.

# Signs of Spring at Our Gardens Pollinator Garden Report



No flowers or other activity just yet, Donna Massa reports, but all the plants are coming in, and that's a good sign. Pictured at left is another sign that says we are on the Pollinator Pathway.

By creating a pollinator garden the parish has joined a growing Northeast-based movement to help pollinators by building "pathways," an effort to connect pollinator gardens to provide food and

shelter that birds, bees and butterflies need to thrive. These public and private spaces are pesticide-free corridors of native plants that provide nutrition and habitat. Even the smallest green spaces, like flower boxes and curb strips, can be part of a pathway that keeps the birds and insects from having to travel too far to find water, food, and shelter. Insects play critical roles in pollinating foods like fruits, vegetables, chocolate, coffee, nuts, and spices (Farmers.gov USDA). Yet 40% of all insect species are declining globally; a third of them are endangered. Projects like our parish pollinator garden help us care for God's creation.

Beginning next month Donna will write about the various native plants in our garden and how each plant supports the life cycles of beneficial insects. (In July: Common Milkweed.) And in her Creation Care Corner, she'll suggest ways in which parishioners can dedicate some portion of their lawns to God, to nature, and to pollinators

# HomeFront 2023 Saturday, September 16

According to its website, HomeFront is "a community-based, volunteer-driven home repair program that provides free repairs to low-income homeowners, thus enabling them to remain in their homes with an

improved quality of life." According to Saint Raphael Parish, HomeFront is a ministry embedded in the fabric of the parish, a handson, practical way of bringing God's love to others, especially those in need. Our long-standing participation in HomeFront continues this year on Saturday, September 16.

Our project: a single family residence in Devon. The scope of work includes leveling the driveway, painting the exterior siding, replacing the front storm door, installing fencing in 3 small areas of the yard and some minor planting/landscaping.

House Captain John Marmolejo and Volunteer Coordinator Carrie Nocerino have issued a call for volunteers. The team needs workers, including professionals, skilled in trades like painting, carpentry, plumbing, electrical and landscaping as well as folks who can assist in food service, yard work and cleanup. The project is scheduled for 7 a.m.-5 p.m. rain or shine. Can't commit for the entire day? John and Carrie are grateful for whatever time you can give. 
