American poet James Russell Lowell posed the question in the nineteenth century. In this, the twenty-first century, the newsletter staff proposes a response: a day when three priests who serve God's people on three different continents come together on a morning in June to celebrate Mass at Saint Raphael Parish in Milford.

And it came about purely by chance. Father Emmanuel Byaruhanga was close to the end of his five-week visit with us. Within just a few days he would be leaving for Uganda, where he is a priest in the Fort Portal Diocese and the rector of a Minor Seminary. Father Hung, newly appointed pastor of Duong Giao Parish in Vietnam, had come to spend a few days with Father John, his mentor when Father Hung was studying at Holy Apostles College and Seminary in Cromwell.

As we profess when we say the Nicene Creed, the Church is one, holy, apostolic and *catholic*, which means *universal*. Like its founding apostles, the Church has been commissioned: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." The photograph at left, from that rare June day, is a striking illustration of the church universal.

It Remains A Time for Prayer

Honoring Apostles This Month Feasts of 3 Apostles on July's Liturgical Calendar

July 3: Saint Thomas Absent when the others first saw the resurrected Jesus, and unbelieving, Thomas is later humbled at the Lord's gentle rebuke and memorably exclaims, "My Lord and my God!"

July 22: Mary Magdalene The first witness to Christ's resurrection, Mary is sent to "tell my brothers" the Good News. Tradition names her "the apostle to the apostles."

July 25: Saint James Often called "the Greater," James, along with his brother John and Simon Peter, acted as an inner circle to Jesus, present with him at special moments, eyewitnesses to his transfiguration.

Donna's Creation Care Corner Common Milkweed: A Gracious Host to Royalty!

The U.S. has no official king or queen, but we do have royalty – the iconic monarch butterfly!

Besides its stunning beauty, this regal butterfly is remarkable as one of but a few insects that migrate – for the monarch a trek of 3,000 miles! However, this miraculous journey is under threat. The monarch butterfly population in North America has plummeted 90 percent in just the last few decades. Destruction of America's grasslands ecosystems, commercial agricultural practices, conventional gardening, and pesticide use have all contributed to the alarming decline of this iconic species. One of the biggest factors is the increasing scarcity of milkweed. Without it, monarchs can't complete their life cycle.

Milkweed is crucial in three interlocking ways: *the female monarch lays her eggs only on milkweed; * the hungry monarch caterpillar can eat up to 25 leaves from its host to gather the energy needed to transform into a chrysalis; *the adult monarch and other beneficial adult insects derive nectar (food) from the milkweed flower.

Common milkweed is the best known of the 100 or so milkweed species native to North America. Female monarchs will lay eggs on all milkweed species, but they prefer common milkweed (*Asclepias syriaca*) and swamp milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*) Since egg-laying preferences may change, however, it is wise to provide other supplementary native species. God loves diversity!

By planting milkweed in our own gardens, landscapes and throughout the community, we can help to reverse the fortune of this noble insect. Saint Raphael's parishioners can actually save the monarch *and* attract and support other crucial pollinators!

When speaking about the environment Pope Francis has reminded us that "Nurturing and cherishing creation is a command God gives to each of us." One simple way to follow that command is to plant for God's insect aristocrat – the royal monarch!


Salute the Stars and Stripes on the 4th and pray that God will bless us with lasting peace, in our homes, on our streets and around the world.
