# Healing Mass Sunday, October 1, 2:00 pm at Saint Ann Church



On Sunday afternoon, October 1 Father John will celebrate a Mass of Healing which will include the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. How appropriate - our parish patron saint is Raphael, whose name means *God heals*.

Since the Second Vatican Council the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick has undergone a transformation. Once called "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction," it is no longer just for those in imminent danger of death, but for all Catholics whose "health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age." Because it is the entire community, the People of God, who pray for God's help for the sick person, Anointing is often celebrated, as it will be at this Mass, with family and friends in attendance. The focus is on trust in God, for whatever happens, and on healing, in whatever form that may take.

When the priest anoints a person's forehead with blessed oil he prays, "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit." When the hands are anointed, he says: "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up." The sick person responds, "Amen."

We encourage all those who are ill or facing surgery to attend this special liturgy. If you would like to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during the Healing Mass, please call the parish office (203-874-0634).

### Is it Time to Stand Up to Protect God's Children? An Invitation from *Protect Connecticut's Children Project*



Are you concerned that our children and grandchildren are being barraged today with confusing, often inappropriate messaging from all directions? Are you concerned that public schools in Connecticut are promoting transgenderism?

What about K-12 schools and public libraries providing our children with materials supporting the transgender ideology? Did you know that educators and public officials need not share information with parents about their minor children's gender identities?

How can we, as Catholic Christians, respond to what's happening in our schools and in the public forum?

We can take action. There are healthy responses we can make based on sound scientific evidence and Catholic teaching and important steps that we can take to protect our children, God's children, from the potential dangers these transgender ideologies present. Many of these children, and their families, are in pain as they struggle with gender dysphoria. All of them are God's beloved children. We must treat them with respect, justice and compassion.

Protect Connecticut's Children Project is a group of Catholic Christians from various parishes in Connecticut and beyond, drawn together out of concern for an in

creasingly difficult cultural situation. We believe that the Bible makes a strong case for defense of children and the family and that a society can be judged by how it treats its children. We invite people of all faiths to join us!

We believe silence in the face of evil is evil itself. We can help each other gather the courage and focus to rid our society of this terrible scourge.

Jesus in Matthew 22 is asked, "Which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" And Jesus responds: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment." Jesus didn't say, "You shall love the Lord your God when it's safe and convenient."

Standing as a community faith in support of our children and families offers us an opportunity to demonstrate love for our Lord with all our hearts and minds. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children." (2223) We cannot surrender that responsibility to the government.

# **Special Guests at Coffee And on October 14 Meet Members of the Lovers of the Holy Cross of Go Vap**

The story begins some years ago in Professor Jack Sopchak's Psych class at Housatonic Community College. Sr. Elizabeth and Sr. Lihn were undergrads pursuing degrees toward fulfilling the mission of their order, Lovers of the Holy Cross of Go Vap of Vietnam. Founded in 1670, the order now serves in dioceses around the world as the sisters vow to follow Christ through lives of prayer, sacrifice and service, especially to the poor, the needy, women and children. Jack's students and a handful of other sisters live near Saint Augustine Cathedral where they serve the Diocese of Bridgeport.

Jack got to know the sisters, who are, he told our reporter, "delightful, not of this world." He and his wife Kathy, after dinners at the convent, invited (and finally convinced) the sisters to "break bread at our house. "They share a "wonderful relationship." The sisters have been frequent guests at "Uncle John" and "Auntie Kathy's" lake house in Middlefield.

"Our parishioners need to see these sisters," Jack decided. One teaches at Kolbe Cathedral, others provide comfort and care to the elderly at Saint Joseph Manor. They are women of prayer, who exude an aura of peace and serenity,



and they'll be with us at the Vigil Mass and at Coffee And on Saturday, October 14.

# GIFT - Growing In Faith Together October - The Sacraments: Overview and Baptism

When we gather this month, GIFT participants will review the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation, Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Matrimony (Marriage), and Holy Orders, then focus on the Sacrament of Baptism.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1213) we learn that "Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access

to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God. We become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission."

October's session will begin at Saint Ann Church with opening prayer, song and activity and continue in the classrooms at the Parish Center with age-appropriate, interactive sessions: Families with children through Grade 4, children in grades 5/6, teens in grades 7 and older (including Confirmation candidates), and adults of all ages.


