Advent:

- In this shortest of all Advent seasons, we will decorate for Christmas following the last Masses on Sunday, December 24th and before the 4:00 p.m. Vigil Masses for Christmas.
- Peter DeMarco has arranged a brief Advent reflection for Friday evening, December 22nd at Saint Ann Church. Archdiocesan Director of Vocations and gifted speaker, Fr. Anthony Federico, will speak on *Growing in Understanding and Love of Jesus in the Eucharist*. The Saint Ann Choir will sing.

On the big screen:

Rose Cox and her committee presented a screening of *The Chosen Christmas* on Sunday afternoon, December 17th to an enthusiastic group of 30+ people. Human Concerns Committee

Meeting Notes from December 4, 2023

Committee Membership

We discussed reasons for Al's departure. We will look for a replacement and ask for ideas from the Church Council about a replacement.

Scope of Our Work

As a new team we decided to re-confirm the scope of work and align our priorities. With Al May leaving under somewhat of an emotional reaction it is important we avoid any future damaging conflicts. We reviewed the description provided in the bylaws and agreed we are on the right track.

Domestic Violence Initiative:

There was some concern among some member(s) about the quality of the decisions made in October and November on this project. The members at this meeting confirmed we made the correct decisions and had a comprehensive approach based on our agreed upon committee responsibilities. We are proud that our new partnership with BHcare will demonstrate measurable results for our parishioners who require their services.

In addition, asking BHcare to educate the youth in the church on how to develop effective and respectful relationships and how to resolve conflict constructively will yield very positive results in ways that cannot be measured. Maria has plans to organize this early 1st quarter 2024.

Protect Connecticut's Children Initiative

We discussed the issues surrounding this initiative. The consensus was the committee can likely support this initiative if more information is collected. Maria will canvass her contacts in the Milford School system to confirm the depth and seriousness of this issue in the Milford schools.

Wally will invite all committee members to the December 7th Zoom meeting for Protect Connecticut's Children.

The committee decided there are other practical actions upon which we can focus (see below).

Supporting Prisoners and Their Relationships

Elizabeth offered an idea to provide Mother's Day cards (and stamps) to prisoners to encourage them to reinforce and/or renew their family relationships which can help reinforce their rehabilitation.

Wally will contact a resource who used to be the Bridgeport Prison Warden and ask his advice, opinions, and his resources to start this (Ed Davies, former warden in Bridgeport).

The committee will continue to assess how to implement this idea at our next meeting.

Facilitate the Baby Box option in Connecticut

To support pro-life activities with our parish and in our archdiocese the committee discussed the possibility of facilitating the opportunity to have Baby Boxes in CT.

Baby Boxes prevent illegal abandonment of newborns by raising awareness, offering a 24-hour hotline for mothers in crisis and offering the Safe Haven Baby Boxes as a last resort option for women who want to maintain complete anonymity while keeping their baby alive (https://www.shbb.org/).

Right now, CT Laws require a mother to surrender her baby to an emergency room nurse. A baby Box provides an anonymous method to surrender their baby to a safe facility.

The committee will discuss this further at our next meeting and decide actions.

Human Trafficking

Elizabeth shared the opportunity to attend a fundraiser for the Newly Established Local Safe Home which helps victims heal from human trafficking. The fundraiser is scheduled for December 6th from 6 PM to 11 PM at The Boston Newton Marriott with a Jim Caviezel meet and greet (Sound of Freedom).

The committee will discuss this issue at our next meeting. We will explore how to support and/or partner with The Underground New England which exists to end sexual exploitation in Connecticut (www.theundergroundne.org).
