Seed Time for the Food Pantry Garden

March was being March as we went to press, roaring like a lion and gifting us with cold, blustery winds, chilly rain and not-frequent-enough days of glorious sunshine. Welcome, April, seed time for our Food Pantry Garden, which supplies fresh vegetables for the 20 or more families the Saint Gabriel Food Pantry feeds each week.

Thanks to the hard work of many parishioners and the intercession of our garden's patron, Saint Isidore, we enjoyed great success last year. We're hoping for another bumper crop, and you can help! Please donate seeds: butternut squash, peppers, tomatoes,

beans, peas, eggplant and others as listed in the weekly bulletin. Leave them by April 6 in the boxes marked "Seeds" in the church vestibules.

Work on the garden resumes at noon on April 6 when the crew will spread the topsoil that Grillo Services donated so generously back in February. Become a Member of the Saint Raphael Social Justice/Human Concerns Committee Make a Positive Difference for Others

Social Justice/Human Concerns, one of the standing committees of the Pastoral Council, hopes more parishioners will join them as they strive to make a positive difference in the lives of people in need, in the parish and in the wider community. The Council's bylaws stipulate that responsibility for the committee and direct them also to work for changes in the structures of society which are oppressive.

The group ministers to the needy through various outreach initiatives: the Garden that supplies fresh vegetables to the Saint Gabriel Food Pantry, for example, (see page 1); working with professional partners to assist victims of domestic violence and exploring ways to reduce human trafficking and the suffering it causes.

A current focus is the passage of new legislation in Connecticut that will permit the installation of Safe Haven Newborn Devices through a program established to prevent illegal abandonment of newborn infants. (Details at https://www.shbb.org/). Also upcoming: The Kindness Project, a two-pronged effort to help incarcerated adults and their families.

Christ's words found in Matthew 7:21 are a guiding principle for the committee's efforts. Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven.



GIFT - Growing in Faith Together - April Sacraments of Service: Marriage and Holy Orders

During April, GIFT participants will explore Marriage and Holy Orders, the two Sacraments of Service, often called Sacraments of Vocation. Couples who enter into Sacramental Marriage and men who are ordained through Holy Orders have a vocation: God has called them to share their lives with others in special ways.

The Christian community shares the joy of couples preparing to enter a new life together in the holy Sacrament of Marriage. Their sacramental commitment is a sign of God's love and faithfulness and an acknowledgement of the importance of God in the lives of both husband and wife. As part of this

GIFT session we will learn more about the Sacrament of Marriage and how we are all called to be faithful witnesses of God's love and to provide support for married couples.

Through the Sacrament of Holy Orders baptized men are called to serve in the name and in the person of Christ, in the midst of the community. Holy Orders includes three levels, or degrees: the ordination of Deacons, of Priests and of Bishops. We will look closely at the sacrament's Rite of Ordination and consider the differences in the roles of Deacons, Priests and Bishops. We will also talk about the significance of the ministerial priesthood in the Catholic Church and in our lives. As part of this session we will discuss our role as members of the common or universal priesthood and how we are called to support ordained ministers in living out their call to be of service to the Church and to the world.

Lastly, we will learn about ways to support the vocations of marriage and the priesthood in our Saint Raphael Parish community. Since November we have offered the Prayer for Priestly Vocations after daily and weekend Masses. April 21 is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, and we encourage our GIFT families to participate in the parish's Vocation Chalice program. This month's GIFT Home Kits will include materials for families to continue prayer, awareness and education about the vocations of marriage, the diaconate, priesthood and consecrated life at home.




