Lent

- Fr. Joe Sica's Lenten booklet of meditations, *The Season for Healing Hearts*, from 23rd Publications has proven very popular, as Fr. Sica's booklets have always been. We have few, if any remaining.
- Parishioners have been taking the Lenten Care Notes and Prayer Notes booklets that have been left in baskets at the church doors.
- Praying and meditating on the Seven Penitential Psalms (6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130 and 143) during Lent is an ancient tradition of the Church. Beginning on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday we have sent one of these Psalms and its reflection to everyone on our parish mailing list as an opportunity for weekly prayer and meditation. We will continue to send them through the Tuesday of Holy Week. Printed copies have been available at each church for those without internet access. Several parishioners have emailed their thanks, some have mentioned downloading and printing the sheets, and folks have been taking the copies left in the churches. Thank you, USCCB, for having the Psalms and Reflections available online!

- Mary Lee Frisbie has been leading Stations of the Cross on Lenten Fridays at 3:00 p.m. at Saint Ann Church. (Great job, Mary Lee!) 30 or more people have been coming to Stations each week; several more have been watching via livestream. This past Friday (March 15) we used Amy Ekeh's very moving and newly published Stations booklet Come to Me, All of You (In the Voice of Christ).
- Maria Tomasetti has coordinated Teen-Led Stations for people of all ages on Friday evenings, alternating between Saint Ann's and Saint Gabriel's. Last scheduled evening Stations: This Friday, March 22 at Saint Gabriel's.
- Father Ricky Manalo's 3-day parish mission *In These Days of Lenten Journey* was well attended and very well received. The Sunday afternoon/Monday and Tuesday evening schedule works very well for the parish. Supporting Prisoners and Their Relationships

- Wally will call our consultant who supports women inmates at Niantic Women's Prison and ask how many inmates for which we can supply cards.

Facilitate the Safe Haven Newborn Device (previously called Baby Box) option in Connecticut

• Elizabeth has created a coalition of individuals and organizations (government and private) that will collaborate to submit a bill in the 2025 legislative session. The purpose is to curb infant death. This device has been successful in saving lives in several other states including Alabama. Wally will contact Kathy Kennedy to gain her support to co-sponsor the bill.
