May Crownings

The month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of Heaven and Earth and our mother. On Mother's Day, May 12, we will honor the Blessed Virgin by crowning the statues of Mary at each of our churches with a wreath of lovely flowers.

We invite you to join us after the 9:30 Mass at Saint Ann's when we will crown the statue of Mary that is outside the church. Gather round and sing with us!

Mary will be crowned at Saint Gabriel Church before the 11 o'clock Mass begins. As he has in the past, Tom Croteau will donate the crown of flowers in memory of his beloved sister, Michelle Papin. Jesse Kirkham will crown Mary and Huxley Quinn will bear the flower bouquet.

The Feast of Pentecost Sunday, May 19

The Feast of Pentecost, fifty days after the Feast of the Resurrection of the Lord, celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit, who came upon the Apostles and disciples with transforming fire, empowering them to proclaim the Gospel of Christ. Pentecost is the birthday of the Church.

Pentecost, Easter and the Sacraments of Initiation

Pentecost marks the close of the Easter season, and what a joyous season it was! During Holy Saturday's Easter Vigil of the Holy Night, on the night when Christ "broke the prison-bars of death and rose victorious," seven people were fully initiated into the Catholic Church.

Four catechumens, Travis Jon Brazeau, D'Ana Mari Lascari, Patrick Dillon Mulligan, and Eleanor Stefani Rothberg were baptized with water blessed this night "so that all who have been buried with Christ by Baptism into death may rise again to life with him." Two candidates, Allyson Catherine Kelly and Tiffanie Elizabeth Rodenberg, who had been baptized in another Christian faith, made a Profession of Faith and came into Full Communion with the Catholic

Church. Julienne Marie Jean, a baptized Catholic, completed her initiation into the Catholic Church. All seven were confirmed, "anointed with the Chrism of salvation," and all seven received Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion.

He and his wife, Judy, a retired nurse, have two daughters, Saint Gabriel School alums Cynthia and Sherri, and are button-popping proud of their four grandchildren: David, who graduates this month from Embry-Riddle in Florida; Lisa, a student at the University of South Florida; Tyler, at Fairfield Prep and Sadie, a student Saint Thomas Aquinas in Fairfield.

It's May, time to mow the lawn - or not! During May pollinators like bees, moths, butterflies and grasshoppers emerge from hibernation and search for food (nectar) and shelter (longer grasses).

Among their favorites, and important for the survival of these insects, so vital to our ecosystem: early bloomers like dandelions and white clover, not found in grass-only, perfectly manicured lawns.




