#### **Standing Committee Reports**

## Prayer and Worship Committee Report from Ann Eden

 The committee met in the Saint Ann Library at 10:00 a.m. Committee members in attendance were Cathy Coda, Ann Eden, Mary Lee Frisbie, Joanne Judd, Joyce Marlow and Rose Marie Marmolejo. Deacon George Sartor was our invited guest.

#### **Pro-Life Presentation;**

- After an opening prayer Deacon George distributed booklets from Catholic Answers Press entitled *Why We're Pro Life*, written by Trent Horn. The booklets were meant to give us some background about the Pro Life presentation that Deacon George is planning, along with Bryan Mercier. Bryan is a Catholic speaker and apologist who lives in Milford, a familiar presence at Saint Raphael Parish. We see him often at Mass with his wife and two young daughters. The presentation is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday evening, June 18 at Saint Ann Church.
- Deacon George would like our committee's help in setting up and publicizing this event, which will feature Bryan's presentation, followed by Q&A, with refreshments in the Children's Chapel.
- The deacon will give an introduction, and pass out the Why We're Pro Life booklets to the congregation when he preaches on June 8/9. Publicity should go out prior to that, to the public and to other parishes, via newspapers, flyers, the Catholic Transcript, internet outlets like Patch, social media, etc. Deacon George will check w/Bryan about the publicity (press releases, graphics (event logo?), images, etc. that Bryan may have used for his other presentations and that we might be able to adapt.).
- Please let me know by May 4 how you can help: publicity (including outreach within whatever groups you are a part of), refreshments, greeter, set up what am I forgetting?
- Before he left, Deacon George encouraged us to pray the Prayer for Priestly Vocations frequently, not simply after Masses, but with our families, with prayer groups, at meetings, etc.

Time for Prayer - review and discussion:

The *Time for Prayer* initiative began in June 2022 as a weekly bulletin insert, asking us to pray as a parish family for an end to violence. Shortly thereafter, with the outbreak of so many conflicts around the globe, we modified our intention: for an end to violence and for peace. After a brief discussion the committee decided to change to a *monthly* insert – *with prayers submitted to Ann by committee members* – and to use the space Monica has so kindly allotted to highlight other prayer and worship related topics.

  - Livestreaming generated a lot of interest.
  - o Friday evening teen-led stations alternating between the 2 churches
- Lenten Supper: Already on the calendar for 3/28/2025! (Thanks, Cathy and Rose Marie.)
- Lenten Retreat March 10-12. Very successful. Ann: Check w/Peter re: 2025.
- Holy Week liturgies;
  - o Holy Thursday 2 candidates and KofC Grand Knight processed w/sacred oils
  - $\circ$  Holy Saturday Blessing of Food went well. More publicity/explanation needed for 2025.
  - Easter Vigil Moving and beautiful. How special to have 7 catechumens/candidates.

#### Change:

- Wednesday Reflections on the 7 Penitential Psalms (Psalms 6,32,38,51,102,130,143)
- Suggestions for a different focus for 2025?
  - Recently we've circulated notes through the bulletin and, of late, via e-blasts, on different Lenten topics: Saints for Lent - 2022; Suggestions for our Lenten journey (ideas for prayer/fasting/almsgiving) - 2023; the Penitential Psalms- 2024. *Please give some thought to ideas for next Lent.*

#### FYI – Wedding/Funeral outreach

- <u>Wedding Outreach</u>: Our Rosary groups, who pray before daily Masses and on Tuesdays at noon, pray during the 3 weeks before their weddings for couples who will be married at Saint Raphael's and for any parishioners we are aware of who will be married outside the parish. At parish rehearsals we give each couple a card wishing them well, signed by the people who have been offering prayers. We give a card to the parents of the out-of-parish couples, as well, during the days before the wedding.
- <u>Funeral Outreach</u>: Within 25-30 days after a funeral at Saint Raphael's we mail a condolence card to the family of/contact person for the deceased. A prayer card that is included has information about the parish Bereavement Support Group. During October we send them an invitation to November's Mass of Remembrance, when we will pray, by name, for those for whom we have celebrated funeral Masses or done graveside services. We include on our list any parishioners' family members we learn about who no longer live in the parish.

• The committee suggested that we highlight these outreach efforts and other Prayer & Worship material in the bulletin, in the *Time for Prayer* space during the weeks when we have no prayer to include.

- The Annual Pork Roast Dinner will be held on June 23<sup>rd</sup>. This is to assist in the fundraising for the annual Home Front Project. Home Front is scheduled for Saturday September 14<sup>th</sup>. Promotional flyers are being distributed this weekend.
- The annual Advent Luncheon is scheduled for November 24<sup>th</sup>. This is a fund raiser for the Food pantry.

#### Faith Formation-Maria Tomasetti

- Our primary First Communion weekend is May 18/19. Children will be receiving their First Holy Communion at the 4:00 pm, 9:30 am and 11:00 am Masses. Our back-up weekend is May 25/26. 21 children have prepared to receive their First Communion in May.
- For 2024/2025, our monthly GIFT program will focus on the Nicene Creed. The GIFT faith formation mailings will go out in late July/early August. Registration materials will be available in both churches for all parishioners, including adults without children and teens. The monthly schedule will also include our Advent/Christmas and Easter celebrations. New for 2024/2025, we will be inviting families with children in Pre-K/Kindergarten to the two celebrations. Our Sacramental program mailings will also go out in late July/early August.
- Confirmation classes are ongoing through June. Make-up classes will be scheduled in mid to late August.
- Our annual parish Graduate Recognition Event is scheduled for Sunday, June 2, 11 am Mass at St. Gabriel Church, followed by a reception and luncheon in the St. Gabriel Hall. This event is open to students graduating from grade 8, high school and college--with their family members and friends.
- Reminder...our 14th annual Summer VBS camp is scheduled for Monday, July 22 thru Friday, July 26 from 9:00 am to 12 noon (for campers ages 4-11). The theme will be SCUBA, diving into friendship with God. Registration is open. Adult volunteers and teens ages 12 and older are needed for camp week as well as for set-up and decorations for several evenings during the weeks of July 8 and July 15.

## **Open Forum**

New Pro-Life Initiative:

Deacon George distributed the "Why We're Pro-Life" pamphlet by Trent Horn to each council member. Deacon explained how and why the pamphlet will be distributed to all parishioners at all masses on June 18th. Deacon is planning to deliver his homily that day about pro-life.

It's the Deacon's, Father John's, and the Council's hope that an ongoing initiative to support Pro-Life will begin soon after this distribution of the pamphlet. To encourage the formation and support of this initiative, three actions are being taken:

- 1. Bryan Mercier will make a pro-life message presentation June 18<sup>th</sup> at 7-8 PM at St. Ann's Church. The Prayer and Workship committee will hold a reception afterwards.
- 2. The Prayer and Worship Committee will promote the Mercier presentation and the initiative.
- 3. The Human concerns Committee will also promote the Mercier presentation and brainstorm ways the Parish Council, the Parish Committees can form and create ongoing support for the new Pro-Life Initiative.

Ideally a new committee will be formed to keep the messages about Pro-Life to keep going.
