

Celebrate Saint Raphael! Triduum Begins on Friday, September 27

The Feast of the Archangels, Raphael, Michael and Gabriel, falls on Sunday, September 29. As a way to celebrate our patron we will honor Saint Raphael with a triduum, three days of prayer that precede his feast.

The triduum begins at Saint Ann's on Friday evening with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by Adoration, the time during which parishioners will lead us in the Rosary and the Litany. Adoration concludes with Benediction: Father John, holding the monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament, will bless all those who have gathered.

In special recognition of Saint Raphael, "health of the sick," we'll be handing out apples after all weekend Masses. An apple a day keeps the doctor away!

Donna's Creation Care Corner The Season of Creation Has Begun

The season began on the first day of September, recognized by many Christian churches and other faith communities around the world as the Feast of Creation. This

year's theme is *To hope and act with Creation*.

Hope is like a muscle: we must use it or will atrophy, and we must use our hope today. Hope is made up of many "acts of prophetic anticipation." To act is to plant trees, to mindfully refuse single-use plastics and much more. To act, in this season of Creation, is to conserve biodiversity, the variety of all living things and their interactions; to treat all creatures with compassion, and to ensure climate justice for all peoples. (Climate justice focuses on the unequal impacts of climate change on marginalized or otherwise vulnerable populations.)

Such actions might seem overwhelming, more than we can handle, until we realize that we are not alone in trying to save the world. Instead, we should consider all such efforts as "acts of worship in hope that Christ will take our humble offerings and transform them as part of the glorious renewal and restoration of all things." Just as Christ fed 5,000 with 5 barley loaves and 2 fish (John 6:5-13) he can transform and multiply our meager offerings as well.

The mysteries of Creation, Incarnation, and Redemption, are the very foundations of our faith. Yet, Creation is the neglected one. Pope Benedict XVI once pointed out, "The Redeemer is the Creator and if we do not proclaim God in His full grandeur – as Creator and as Redeemer – we diminish the value of the Redemption."

The gate to the garden fell over, victim of a recent storm, and the deer had a field day - chewed up the tomato plants and cucumber leaves, and devoured every leaf from our beans. Thankfully, they didn't seem to care for the flowers, so we should see a good green bean harvest soon.

GIFT - Growing in Faith Together Theme for 2024/2025: The Nicene Creed

Throughout this GIFT season we will learn about the Nicene Creed, the Profession of Faith that we say and pray every week at Mass. *I believe*, we begin, and every line that follows expresses important truths of our Catholic faith.

During GIFT's six sessions we will deepen our understanding of the Trinity, our belief in one God who is three persons: God the Father, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit. Some sessions will focus on Jesus, one person with two natures, fully human and fully divine. We will explore some truths about Jesus, his Incarnation and his Passion, and the reason for his life, suffering, death and resurrection. We will also learn more about the four "marks" of the Church: "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic."

In September we will introduce the sections of the Nicene Creed and focus on God the Father and the Trinity. GIFT sessions are open to people of all ages, from 5 - adult. Children and teens attend with at least one parent/guardian, enabling important learning to continue at home. We welcome the participation of couples and single adults.

After opening activities (and a pizza dinner!) groups meet in ageappropriate break-out sessions like Families with children through Grade 4; 5th and 6th graders; teens (Grade 7 and older); and adults of all ages.




