Pray the International Rosary Tuesday Evening, October 8 at Saint Gabriel Church

The International Rosary, a well-loved parish tradition that honors Mary during this month of the Holy Rosary, returns on Tuesday evening, October 8 beginning at 7 o'clock at Saint Gabriel Church.

This year we will pray the Luminous Mysteries for the intention of priests. A reflection, a prayer for priests and a Marian hymn will follow each of the Mysteries. Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, the Little Flower, wrote a prayer that



reads in part, "O Jesus, keep your priests within the shelter of your Sacred Heart, and let Your holy love surround them."

Multi-lingual parishioners will lead each decade in a different language and the congregation will respond in English. (See the French/English sample above.) In French, German, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese and Vietnamese our prayers will rise like incense, reflecting the richness of the universal Church.

Please plan to be with us for this very special tribute to Our Lady of the Rosary. Come, and bring a friend. The evening will close with tasty refreshments in Saint Gabriel Hall.

Donna's Creation Care Corner Saint Francis and Creation



How fitting that the monthlong observance of the Season of Creation ends on October 4th, the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi. Indeed, the year 2024 marks 45 years since Pope Saint John Paul II officially named Francis the patron saint of ecology.

But there was much more to the young man from Assisi than his love of nature and animals. Francis took very seriously Jesus' words to the rich young man in Matthew's Gospel, "Go, sell what you have and give it to the poor. Then come, follow me." Francis and his companions, who became his "brothers," lived a life of radical poverty. As one biographer has written, "Francis did not try to

abolish poverty; instead, he tried to make it holy." Because he wanted people to be able to visualize Christ's nativity he created the first creche. In his desire and need to be inclusive, he not only founded the Franciscan order for brothers, but also a religious community for women, the Poor Clares, and one for laypeople, the Third Order Regular. Extremely ill at the end of his short life - Francis died at 44 - in his suffering, he prayed to share in Christ's passion: as a result, he received the stigmata, the five wounds of Christ.

Today Francis is probably best known for his love of nature and of animals. But his relationship with the natural world was truly spiritual. It went much deeper than loving, caring for, respecting or admiring God's works. He believed firmly in the Creed of Saint Athanasius: "First, it is of faith that God is present by His Essence everywhere and in all things by reason of His Immensity." Genesis 1:31 revealed to him the metaphysical value of creation: "God saw all that He had made, and it was very good." Francis truly believed that God is present in nature, and that all of God's creatures, are intrinsically part of his brotherhood, and he lived his beliefs fully and deeply. He was known to have conducted a lecture for birds, to have freed rabbits from traps and fishes from hooks, cautioning them to be more alert, and not to get caught again.



The true homage Francis paid to the divine presence he found in nature occurred during an intense

illness just two years before his death. Rather than focus on his ailments, his mind turned, as always, toward God and His presence in creation. It was then that he wrote "The Canticle of the Sun," an expression of his brotherhood with God's handiwork. "Praised be You, my Lord," he wrote, "with all your creatures."

"Despite all our efforts," the report went on, *varmints* (emphasis added) continue to feast on our garden." Results caused by "whatever makes it inside our fencing": the leaves and blossoms of most of the pepper plants and many of the tomatoes have been eaten off, leaving just stems. The squash, too, are gone, but some cakes are trying to grow.

Elizabeth did her best MASH impersonation, providing immediate, lifesaving care to casualties. We join her in hoping that we'll be able to harvest some veggies in the next several weeks. *Saint. Isidore, pray for us.*
