
Parish Mass of Remembrance Sunday, November 17

Staples on the pantry's Most Needed Items list include: boxed cereal, pasta (any shape), jarred pasta sauce (24 oz.), coffee, Knorr pasta and rice sides, soup, Mac and cheese, canned tomatoes, pudding and Jello, canned fruits and vegetables, facial tissues, toilet paper, small size laundry detergent. Festive as they appear decked in their colorful gift tags, the trees become more beautiful as they are stripped of their ornaments by the members of the parish family. Your generosity is a true sign of the love that is the reason for this season.

Please take a gift tag (more than one, if you can) and return the gift(s), with tag(s) attached, when you come to Mass on December 7/8 or December 14/15. The gift tag will indicate whether or not your gift should be wrapped. Please return gifts by Sunday, December 15, if possible. Our holiday elves want to be sure that all the gifts are delivered by Christmas Day. May God bless you for your kindness.

Sign Up for Beth-El's Welcome Home Ministry Assist Households Moving to Permanent Housing

Welcome Home Ministry is a new initiative spearheaded by faith communities, Saint Raphael Parish among them, in partnership with the Beth-El Center (BEC). Historically BEC has supported households moving to permanent housing by acquiring home goods and providing moving support. Since the COVID-19 pandemic the funds and bandwidth that supported these efforts have decreased, while the population BEC serves has increased in vulnerability. With 80% of individual households now above age 55 and facing complex medical issues, they have limited ability to provide their own moving needs or to acquire the home goods necessary in their new homes.

In an attempt to meet these needs BEC is looking for volunteers who can provide a truck or other vehicle, and/or can lift and move furniture and household goods. 


