The drive-thru, for non-perishable foods, paper goods and personal hygiene products, runs from 11:00 a.m until 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 25 in the Saint Ann Parking Lot.

Please drive into the parking lot up to the glass doors of the Parish Center, then pop your car's trunk. Our smiling teens will unload your donations, then sort them for delivery to the Saint Gabriel Food Pantry and Beth-El Center, this year's recipient organizations. Please check January's weekly bulletins and the tables by the church doors for lists of the items each organization needs most. You will also find details that explain how the Food Pantry and Beth-El Center help our local community. We will also provide information for people who prefer to donate checks or food gift cards.

We will gratefully accept all non-perishable food items. And the drive-thru is not your only opportunity to make Souper Bowl of Caring donations. You may bring them to Saint Ann or Saint Gabriel Church any weekend during January or February.

Donna's Creation Care Corner Composting - A Great Way to Start the New Year (And the City of Milford has just the program for you!)



Composting. You've read about it, thought about it, decided you really should try it - but not yet. The City of Milford to the rescue!

Under the leadership of Mayor Tony Giannattasio, Public Works Director Chris Saley and Asst. Director Steve Johnson, DPW has set up a voluntary program, Food Scrap Collection, that should help Milford strive toward a greener future. Here's how it works:

Collect your food scraps at home (See the box at right for acceptable items.) and bring them to the Transfer Station at 775 Oronoque Road. (Use a permanent bucket or compost container that can be used again, rather than a plastic bag.) Empty them into the totes at the rear of the Transfer Station. The City has partnered with Curbside Compost, a local company, to help dispose of the collected materials.

Two major goals of the program are to combat the ever-growing issue of food waste and to usher in more sustainability in Milford. According to the press release from the city's Public Works Department, every year we throw out thousands of tons of food just here in the City of Milford. However, the Food Scrap Collection Program will make trash disposal more efficient and will reduce city operating costs – a plus for everyone. With compost collection, we can start to reuse and repurpose organic waste by taking it to local farms and companies that will turn it into compost and, in some cases, energy. By participating in the Food Scrap Collection Program, Milford residents can play a vital role in preserving our environment for future generations.

Our dedication to social justice dovetails beautifully with HomeFront, a community-based, volunteer-driven program that provides free repairs to low-income homeowners - older adults, veterans, persons with disabilities, single-parent households and parents in crisis due to illness or job loss. Our team is made up of parishioners, some with repair skills and some without, who work side-by-side making homes warmer, safer and healthier and having a lot of fun in the process. The need is great: Every year HomeFront receives hundreds of requests from families in need in our area.

We had recruited volunteers and raised funds to support a 2024 project that was canceled unexpectedly. All donations toward that effort will apply to this year's project. We are most grateful to everyone who contributed. We now have a bit of a leg up for 2025 and are building momentum toward making this year's project the best ever. Saint Raphael Parish GIFT Program - Growing in Faith Together

The Archdiocese of Hartford continues to require that, every year, we offer a personal safety program for families with children and teens registered in our GIFT program (Grade 1 through Confirmation). Beginning this month we will offer VIRTUS: Teaching Safety - Empowering God's Children, a program that replaces Child Lures or Teen Lures Preventions program from previous years.

The new program, VIRTUS: Teaching Safety - Empowering God's Children, provides children and teens with the age-appropriate tools they need to help keep them safe. It does this by educating them in regard to boundaries, safe and unsafe behaviors and healthy relationships.

The scheduled dates for 2025 appear in the box above. The programs - for both children and teens - require the participation of an adult. We will begin with pizza in the Parish Center for the first 30 minutes of each session.

Jubilee Year 2025 - Pilgrims of Hope

On Christmas Eve, December 24, Pope Francis opened the Holy Door to Saint Peter's Basilica and inaugurated Jubilee Year 25. A jubilee, or holy year, is a time of pilgrimage, prayer, repentance and acts of mercy. It is, in the words of Pope Francis, "an event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church."



The theme for this year, as depicted in the logo at left, is "Pilgrims of Hope."

The four stylized figures symbolize all of humanity from the four corners of the earth. Each of them embraces another, indicating the solidarity and brotherhood that must unite people. The face of Jubilee 2025 is its official mascot, Luce. Clad in a yellow rain jacket, the hood of which partially covers her blue hair, she carries a pilgrim's staff and wears the mud-stained boots of a "long and difficult journey." Her shining eyes, with their scallop shell highlights, are a symbol of "the hope of the heart." We will publish more information about Jubilee 2025 in the months ahead.
