

Lent begins in purple and ashes, traditionally associated with repentance and humility. It is a season of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. In addition, as Pope Francis has written, "Lent is precisely the season of hope, when we turn back to God." The Holy Father, who often reflects on the theological virtues in his messages, used a poetic image from the French poet Charles Péguy in describing Lent as a time of conversion, when "faith and charity take hope, this small child, by the hand. They teach her to walk, and at the same time, she leads them forward." Please read here and in the weekly bulletin about the various Lenten opportunities available this month at Saint Raphael Parish. May we live, learn, grow and rejoice as we make our Lenten pilgrimage.



Not By Bread Alone, Daily Reflections for Lent

Prayerfully journey through Lent with inspiring and meaningful reflections on the daily Mass readings. In just a few minutes each day, the insightful meditations of Not by Bread Alone can deepen your experience of this season of prayer and penance. The booklets, a gift from the parish, are available at the doors of both churches.

From the introduction by Daniel P. Horan: "The reflections in this little book are invitations to remember that Lent is always tied to the joy of Easter, to the Christian hope expressed in the resurrection. The way we come to know that joy and hope, even amid the suffering and struggles of our world, is by becoming people of Scripture and prayer. Consider

these reflections an invitation to deeper engagement with Scripture this Lent. And may the meditations and prayers that accompany them provide you with food for your own spiritual journey."

After a brief period of silent Adoration parishioners will lead us in a Litany of Hope. Adoration concludes with Benediction. Then, holding the monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament, Father John will bless all those who have gathered, before he returns the Blessed Sacrament to the tabernacle. The program's theme is from the Gospel words of Jesus to a man with a withered hand: Stretch out your hand. And the man is healed. There will be readings, the inspirational music of Peter and the Saint Ann choir, and time for prayerful reflection. You will want to be there.

Within a setting of glowing northern lights, majestic mountains, glistening glaciers and racing rivers they'll encounter a wild world where it might be easy to lose their way. But the campers will be tracking Jesus, a faithful friend we can trust completely. Jesus will always point us in the right direction. He is our *True North!*

Campers will share Wild Bible Adventures, with buddies like Earnest the Eagle (seen flying nearby), Ponder the sea otter, Claudia, the King Crab, Kody the Bear and Bruce the Moose, who will help them remember Bible points from the Gospel of Matthew. afternoon March 2 at 2 o'clock in the Saint Ann's Children's Chapel. Please call Joanne (203-877-4020) for additional information.


