## **Papal Encouragement on our Lenten Journey**

On Ash Wednesday, as Lent began, our gracious and merciful God spoke to us through the prophet Joel: Return to me with your whole heart. Signed with the ashes of repentance we set off on our journey of return, designated by Pope Francis as *pilgrims of hope*.

In this year's Lenten message, Pope Francis offered some encouragement: Let us journey together in hope. Let hope be the focus of our Lenten journey towards the victory of Easter. His message goes on: Christ, my hope, has risen! He lives and reigns in glory. Death has been transformed into triumph.

# Donna's *Creation Care Corner*Microplastics and the Sound

How blessed we are at Saint Raphael Parish to live so near Long Island Sound! Because Milford boasts 17 miles of coastline along the Sound we are privileged to see her in all her moods, dark and stormy under grey skies, shimmering with diamonds on a clear and sunny day, serenely calm on a windless afternoon. And with God's blessing comes responsibility: we are to care for God's generous gift. She needs our help now.

Since 2017, Save the Sound, whose mission is to protect and improve the land, air, and water of the whole Long Island Sound region, has collected over 500,000 pieces of trash, mostly plastic, from LIS. More than 600 marine species worldwide have been adversely affected by plastic.

Plastics have an amazing upside, including the development of computers and cell phones and advances in medicine. In a March 2025 issue of Forbes, heart and lung transplant surgeon Bill Frist wrote, "Disposable syringes, IV bags, surgical gloves, and catheters dramatically reduced infection rates and made modern healthcare safer."

But plastics, especially single-use plastics like water bottles, break down into microplastics, particles smaller than 5mm in size. They have been found in drinking water, toothpaste, facial scrubs and various foods. In the same article Frist wrote that there is "alarming evidence of microplastics' presence in human

brains, lungs, bloodstreams, and even the placenta. Researchers have now linked microplastics to inflammation, oxidative stress (two hallmarks of Alzheimer's disease), immune dysfunction, metabolic disorders, and even cognitive decline." NIH has found that a single plastic water bottle contains approximately 120,000 tiny microplastics.

As faith-filled, health conscious Catholics concerned about the environment we want to reduce the amount of plastic in our lives. Recycling, unfortunately is not the answer: according to MIT, only 6% of plastics are recycled yearly in the U.S. Thankfully, there are quick-and-easy preventive actions we can take:

### When dining out or getting take-out, refuse:

\*plastic straws: used once for a few minutes, they take hundreds of years to break down.

\*plastic flatware: keep permanent flatware handy in your car. **Grab:** those take-out containers already piling up at home for your leftovers when dining out. The U.S. consumes one trillion individual pieces of disposable food-ware and packaging yearly. **Embrace permanent water bottles:** People buy a *million plastic bottles EVERY MINUTE*; in the United States alone. More than 60 million end up in landfills and incinerators *every day*!

**Use permanent bags:** at grocery stores/for all shopping. Americans discard 102 billion plastic bags yearly!

**Compost food waste:** Composts reduce the number of plastic bags that haul food scraps and trash to landfills where food waste creates methane.

#### Switch to:

\*shampoo bars: over 552 million shampoo bottles go to landfills yearly.

\*hand/body soap bars: over 1 billion plastic body-wash bottles are discarded yearly.

\*eco-laundry strips: over 900 million laundry jugs end up as garbage yearly.

Pope Francis reminds us, "Efforts by households to reduce pollution and waste, and to consume with prudence, are creating a new culture." At home, let us begin spring with a new culture that saves not only the Sound, but also ourselves from plastic

Nomination forms are in the bulletin. Please drop your completed forms into the collection basket by April 5. New members will be chosen by lot (a system recorded in Scripture) from the group of final nominees.


