Volunteers Needed for HomeFront Day, May 17


The parish HomeFront team has issued a call for assistance for this year's repair project.

Donna's Creation Care Corner Protect the Piping Plover, One of God's Cutest Creatures

Finally! A month into spring and we've been blessed with some warm, sunny days. Let's head to the beach for some surf, sand, leisure, and recreation. Be mindful, however, that our shore also has another function, one that's crucial for God's creation – it provides critical breeding sites for beach-nesting birds, like the Piping Plover, listed since 1986 under the Endangered Species Act.



Adult Piping Plovers are very similar in appearance, but the male has a black bar across his forehead and his neck collar is darker and goes nearly all the way around. During breeding season, the males dress up: their bands grow darker as they try to attract the lady plovers, sporting their version of a top hat and tux. Nothing, however, is cuter than a Piping Plover chick with its tiny, fluffy body and its ability to run really fast – fuzz on wheels!

Before you head to the beach this year, remember to protect the Piping Plover and other nesting shorebirds. Nesting parents are under a lot of stress - they may still be recovering from migration. Disturbing birds prevents them from resting and feeding; even if we mean no harm, birds can experience reduced survival rates and egg failure. Piping Plover chicks are precocial; they can walk and forage within a few hours of hatching. But because the chicks are dependent on parental warmth to maintain a stable body temperature, parents and chicks should not be frightened away from each other.

Visit the Be-A-Good-Egg website at https://ct.audubon.org/bird-friendly-at-the-beach for tips and helpful information on sharing the shore with nesting birds, then click on and sign the Be A Good Egg pledge you'll find on the first page. To learn more about birds, download the Merlin app to your phone. This free resource is incredible for identifying birds you see and hear. All About Birds and eBird are two additional online resources for "all things birds."

Gee, there's a lot to think about and remember before you go to the beach, not just your towel and sunscreen. But once you've observed God's tiny, vulnerable creatures for the first or even the hundredth time, you will thank our loving Father for yet another wonder of creation.
