A Visit from the Archbishop Sunday, November 2nd

Archbishop Christopher Coyne's upcoming visit to Saint Raphael Parish is the fulfillment of a pledge and, in the Archbishop's own words, a blessing. When he began his episcopal ministry as the Sixth Archbishop of Hartford. in May of 2024 the Archbishop spoke of himself not as "a lonely Shepherd who walks ahead of the flock," but as "one who walks in the midst of the flock" - a flock spread out across 117 parishes. As a way to fulfill his pledge to visit his widespread flock he usually says Mass at a different parish each weekend.

During his visit. with us Archbishop Coyne will be the principal celebrant of the 9:30 a.m. Mass on November 2, The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day). Along with offering the Mass and homily, the Archbishop hopes to meet you at the after-Mass reception in the Parish Center Auditorium. You will find him approachable and friendly.

The Archbishop enjoys meeting his parishioners and hopes you will share with him your thoughts about our faith, our parish and our archdiocese. He knows the importance of listening to and really hearing "what you, my brothers and sisters in Christ, have to say."

Donna's Creation Care Corner Borgo Laudato Si'

In September, during the first week of this year's Season of Creation, Pope Leo officially inaugurated Borgo Laudato Si', a new educational and economic center located at the Papal Gardens of Castel Gandolfo, which has served for centuries as a summer residence and vacation retreat for the pope. Borgo means village in Italian. and the Borgo Laudato Si' village extends over 85 acres of gardens and 50 acres of farmland.

In May of 2015 Pope Francis wrote in his encyclical Laudato Si': "God created the world and entrusted it to us as a gift. Now we have the responsibility to care for and protect it." As a new "zero environmental impact" complex with solar-powered classrooms and a greenhouse, the center is devoted to making Pope Francis's ideals a reality. To that end the center promotes an integral ecology, a requirement of our faith that calls us to protect people and the planet. It also promotes an inclusive economy – one that is both circular and generative, a system that aims to eliminates waste and pollution by designing products for reuse, repair, and recycling.



Pope Leo has fully embraced Pope Francis's message about creation. In a recent address, he said, "People of faith cannot love God while despising His creatures, and people cannot call themselves Christians without caring for the earth." He added, "God will ask us if we have cultivated and cared for the world that he created, for the benefit of all and for future generations, and if we have taken care of our brothers and sisters."

"There is no room for indifference or resignation," Pope Leo stated firmly, echoing a warning from Pope Francis in the 2022 documentary *The Letter:* We are "becoming used to" climate catastrophes. Most importantly, Pope Francis stated that "becoming used to it" is "a terrible illness." Pope Francis called the earth "our common home," and Pope Leo has expressed the same sentiment: "We are one family, with one Father.", and "We inhabit the same planet and must care for it together."

The Season of Creation, which began September 1st, officially ended on October 4th, the Feast Day of Saint.Francis of Assisi. The year 2026 will begin the celebration of the 800th anniversary of the 1226 death of "Little Poor Man.". Saint Francis would undoubtedly approve of the new complex and of these two most recent Popes, who have engaged in bold and positive actions to love and care for creation.

Boxes of Joy Are On Their Way!



Thanks to your generous donations and to the hard-working members of T4S who assembled and packed them on Thursday, October 23^rd, our Christmas Boxes of Joy are on their way to children ages 2-4, 5-9 or 10-14 in Honduras, Malawi, Peru, Dominican Republic, Haiti, El Salvador,

Grenada, Guatemala, and other developing countries. It's a journey with lots of stops!

First, our local drop-off center, Saint Margaret Parish Center in Madison. Next, Cross Catholic Outreach in Miami, FL, the National Screening Center where contents will be checked for safety and matched with the children who will receive them. *The Story of Jesus* will be added to each box, a booklet in the child's own language.

Cross Catholic Outreach ministry partners in each country will distribute the aptly named Boxes of Joy. Many of the children have never received a Christmas present, so this will be a very special Christmas for them.

Thank you for participating in the Box of Joy program, for your kindness and for praying for the children and their families. With your support we can spread Christmas joy one box at a time!




